The NACC did not have a formal meeting in August as myself and many agency representatives instead used the time to strategise with Treasury officials about how future asbestos funding needs might be met.

So many highlights!

Just a few of the recent highlights discussed at our November meeting:

- Local Government NSW and Coates RTO won the prestigious Industry Collaboration Award at the Department of Education's 2023 Training Awards. The award recognised the *Statement of Attainment in Asbestos Related Work for Local Government*, which has already been delivered to more than 1000 local government workers across NSW.

Office of the Chief Scientist and Engineer gets involved

I am very excited that the Office of the Chief Scientist and Engineer is undertaking a project looking at asbestos management in the context of waste intended to be beneficially reused. The NACC is keen for an improved evidence base on the risk tolerance, health and environmental impacts and technologies available to deal with asbestos found in waste that would otherwise be re-usable. Phase three of the Asbestos National Strategic Plan (2024-2030) is nearing completion. Compiled by the Australian Government's Asbestos Safety and Eradication Agency, the plan focuses on safe and sustainable ways to remove asbestos containing materials from the built environment. The NACC stands ready to implement the plan within NSW once it is released.
